Details of the event	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. On 13.10.2023, a poster-making competition was organized for high school students across the district. The theme of the competition was "Our Disaster Management" (ഞങ്ങളുടെ ദുരന്ത നിവാരണം). A panel, consisting of art teachers, was formed at the district level in collaboration with the District Education Officer (DDE) to select the top three positions from among the 29 entries received. The details of the winners were subsequently communicated to the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) via email. 2. In observance of the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction, a practical session on fire safety, water safety, and home security was held at the Tribal Welfare School in Anakkal, Malampuzha-I. Students and nearby tribal community members learned about fire extinguisher use, water safety, and CPR for water accident scenarios, enhancing their safety awareness and skills. Active participation, discussions, and questions from students and community members deepened their understanding of safety procedures. Total participants: 89 3. On 13.10.2023, a comprehensive first aid session was conducted at Malampuzha Dam for personnel from various departments, including irrigation, security, dam

	<p>watchers, ropeway operations, and session officers. Deputy Thasildar, Mr. Santhosh, presided over the inaugural ceremony, with a welcome speech by Irrigation Assistant Engineer, Mr. Neeraj. The training, led by Grade I Nursing Officer Mr. Manoj VR from District Hospital, Palakkad, covered diverse medical emergencies, including insect and mammal bites, reptile bites, snakebites, drowning, falls, patient positioning techniques like log rolling and recovery position, and the Heimlich maneuver for choking. Practical hands-on training enhanced the learning experience. Total participants: 32</p>
