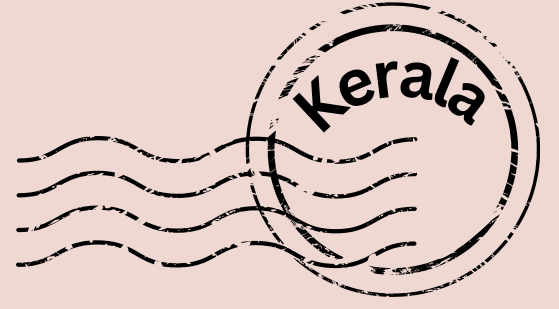

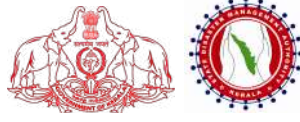

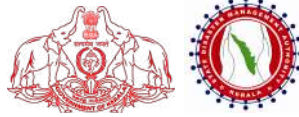

## About Kerala State Disaster Management Authority

KSDMA is a statutory non-autonomous body under the Chairmanship of the Chief Minister of Kerala. The portfolio of Disaster Management in the State of Kerala is held directly by Hon'ble Chief Minister vide Notification No. Pol-5/21/2023-GAD dated 30-1-2023. The first KSDMA was constituted vide S.R.O No. 395/2007 dated 4th May 2007. Present composition of KSDMA is notified vide S.R.O No. 583/2013 dated 17-7-2013. Vide Section 3 of the Kerala State Disaster Management Rules (KSDMR), 2007 the authority is composed of ten (10) members, chaired by Chief Minister and convened by the Additional Chief Secretary, Revenue and Disaster Management. The Chief Secretary (inter alia Chairperson of the State Executive Committee) is the Chief Executive Officer of KSDMA vide Section 14 (4) of the DM Act, 2005. Head of Kerala State Emergency Operations Centre is vide Section 3 (4) of KSDMR, 2007 (amendment 2015) the Member Secretary of the Authority. Commissioner, Disaster Management is the Head of the Department of KSDMA vide GO (Rt) No. 772/2020/DMD dated 1-10-2020. Routine decisions related to the functioning of KSDMA, as under the Disaster Management Act, 2005 is conducted as per the decision of the State Executive Committee by the Office of KSDMA. Technical matters and emergency operations are managed by Kerala State Emergency Operations Centre (KSEOC).

**NOTE**

The Government of Kerala has offered assistance to the Government of Tamil Nadu in light of the ongoing major floods. During my telephonic discussion with the Chief Secretary, Tamil Nadu today, the following assistance has been requested:

**1) Supply of dry ration kits**

Shri. M. G. Rajamanickam IAS, Principal Director, Local Self Government Department is placed in charge of coordinating the supply of dry ration kits. The objective is to move ration kits to Tirunelveli in the shortest time possible. He shall be at liberty to form teams of officers to assist him. The Member Secretary, Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) and all other officers concerned shall assist Shri. M. G. Rajamanickam IAS.

**2) Technical support in restoring water supply systems**

Smt. Bhandari Swagat Ranveerchand IAS, Managing Director, Kerala Water Authority is placed in charge of providing technical support to the Government of Tamil Nadu for restoring water supply systems. The experience of KWA in restoring water supply systems after the 2018 floods in Kerala would be beneficial. Managing Director, KWA may urgently form sufficient teams to provide all technical assistance. If necessary, equipment and consumables may also be mobilized.

All officers concerned shall accord top most priority to fulfilling the above requests.

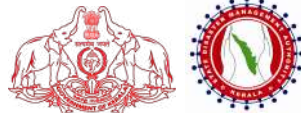

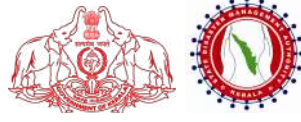

## FOREWARD

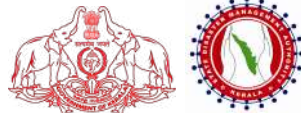

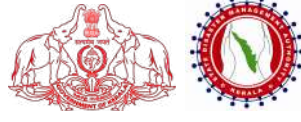

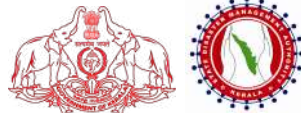
## The Way Forward

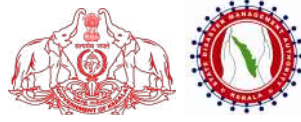




*outcomes of assistance not only fosters a compassionate societal ethos but also transcends societal distinctions, fostering an understanding that distress transcends geographic borders.*

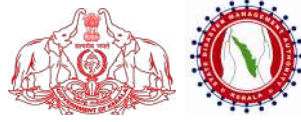

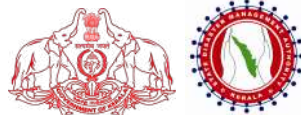
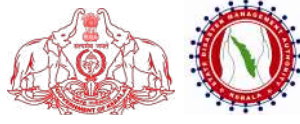


Figure 17: Member Secretary Dr Sekhar L Kuriakose handing over the items to Sri Chitra Home for Destitute and Infirm representatives .....	33

## THE BACKGROUND

On December 21, 2023, following a directive from the Government of Kerala, a delegation convened at the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority office to mobilise relief assistance for flood affected in Tamil Nadu.

M. G. Rajamanickam IAS, the Principal Director of the Local Self-Government Department and Commissioner for Rural Development in the Government of Kerala was entrusted with the coordination of relief efforts in partnership with the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority.

The delegation promptly initiated the launch of **அன்போடு கேரளம்/ANBODU KERALAM 2023**. In the initial phase, 1000 [food kits](#),<sup>1</sup> each comprising 22 items<sup>2</sup> for a household, were meticulously assembled. The information about the flood relief material collection drive was disseminated through [news channels and various social media platforms](#).<sup>3</sup>

The program **அன்போடு கேரளம்/ANBODU KERALAM** was formulated with a focus on a [need-based approach](#).<sup>4</sup> Distinct aim and objectives were identified and articulated to streamline the drive.

## THE MOTTO - *collaboration transcends unity*

In the context of a flood relief collection drive for a neighboring state, the motto “collaboration transcends unity” becomes a guiding principle that extends beyond the mere act of coming together for a shared cause. This statement encapsulates the essence of a collective effort aimed at providing support and relief to those affected by the devastating floods in our neighboring community.

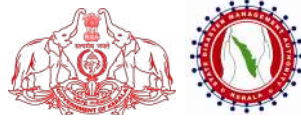

**UNITY**: in the context of disaster relief unity, often implies a common acknowledgment of the crisis and a joint response to address immediate needs. However, “collaboration transcends unity” takes this a step further, emphasising a more profound and interconnected approach to the relief efforts.

**COLLABORATION**: it implies active and synergistic engagement among diverse stakeholders – individuals, communities, businesses, governmental bodies, and NGOs – all pooling their resources, expertise, and compassion to create a collective impact. It suggests a dynamic and sustained effort where each participant contributes not only their resources but also their unique strengths, skills, and perspectives to address the multifaceted challenges.

**TRANSCENDING UNITY**: underscores the importance of fostering relationships, understanding, and empathy among collaborators. It encourages an environment where individuals and organisations not only contribute to the relief drive but also actively seek to comprehend the unique needs and challenges of the affected community, promoting a more compassionate and effective response.

## AIM

To provide assistance to rebuild and restart the lives of the affected.

## OBJECTIVES

### 1. Solidarity and Support:

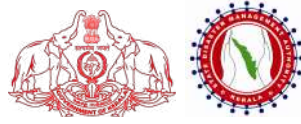
- **Aim**: Foster a sense of solidarity and support among the citizens of Kerala by organising the relief material collection drive under the project “**அன்போடு கேரளம்/ANBODU KERALAM**”, unveiling empathy and compassion towards those affected by the drastic flood in Tamil Nadu.

### 2. Emergency Assistance:

- **Aim**: Provide swift and targeted emergency assistance to the flood-affected communities in the neighbouring state by collecting essential relief materials, ensuring timely delivery to address immediate needs and contributing to their recovery process.

### 3. Community Resilience:





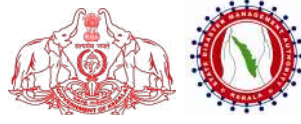
- Aim: Strengthen community resilience in the face of natural disasters by encouraging active participation in the relief material collection drive, emphasising the importance of unity and preparedness for future challenges.

## THE COMPREHENSIVE REPORT

The Government of Tamil Nadu requested the delivery of relief materials to various collection points in Thoothukudi, the port city renowned as the Pearl City of Tamil Nadu.



The collection drive, spanning from December 22, 2023, to December 29, 2023, successfully transported a total of 16 loads (14 from the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority office and the remaining two from Palakkad-Malabar Feeds and Chennai-Ramachandra) to Thoothukudi. The designated collection point for flood relief materials was the KSDMA office situated at Observatory Hills, opposite Kanakakkunnu Palace in Thiruvananthapuram. The basement [car parking area](#)<sup>5</sup> of the office was repurposed as a warehouse to facilitate the collection, organisation, and packaging of relief materials.

The collection drive was organised into different phases, tailored to the specific needs and requirements of the communities. Each phase was developed in response to requests from the authorities in Tamil Nadu.

The comprehensive set of relief materials dispatched includes food kits, utensils kits, single-burner gas stoves, bleaching powder, anti-fungal cream, sarees, t-shirts, baby diapers, pads, cattle feeds, and bulk quantities of materials incorporated in the relief kits.

## PHASE I – FOOD KIT

Considering into account the urgency and evaluating the appropriateness in terms of quality, quantity, and cost of the essential items needed for the food kit, Ramachandra was identified as the suitable choice for the immediate procurement of the required items in bulk.

Initially, the relief drive focused on distributing [Food Kits](#)<sup>6</sup> comprising 22 items resulting in the delivery of a total of 2814 food kits. Out of them, 1000 kits were provided in kind by [SBI](#)<sup>7</sup> and 100 by NGO Union.

KSDMA secured 1000 kits from Ramachandra, with the [rice](#)<sup>8</sup> component totalling 10, 200 kilograms sourced from Paulraj & Company, predominantly [Ponni rice](#).<sup>9</sup> Additionally, 1250

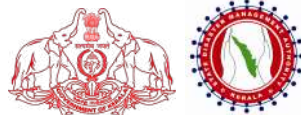

kilograms of Ponni rice were acquired from [Pothys](#).<sup>10</sup> The water supply for the kits, amounting to [10800 bottles](#),<sup>11</sup> was generously received in-kind through four loads, each consisting of 225\*12 bottles. KSDMA acquired buckets and mugs from Family Plastics, purchasing a total of [3000 buckets and 3000 mugs](#).<sup>12</sup>

Following the successful assembly of 2100 kits in adherence to the guidelines, we experienced substantial cooperation and contributions from various communities, including local self-government institutions such as grama panchayats, block panchayats, municipalities, corporations, unions, associations, humanitarian collectives, and individual donors. A significant portion of these contributions consisted of bulk single items, such as clothing, rice, atta, rawa, etc. With the available items, KSDMA proceeded to acquire the necessary items to fill the kits with the missing materials. There were 649 lungi, 649 nighty, 2596 towels, bedsheets (floral-424, chamkala-329) and [additional food kit items](#)<sup>13</sup> in the procured list. Also the remaining was collected [in kind](#)<sup>14</sup> through Tamil Sangam, Naadar Sangam, Rotary from Pothy's and Ramachandra. And total 714 more food kits were assembled.

In terms of [in-kind donations](#),<sup>15</sup> various organisations and groups generously contributed essential items for the relief effort. These donations played a crucial role in supplementing the relief materials and meeting the diverse needs of the affected communities. Because to guarantee the prompt distribution of materials to the impacted regions, we opted to assemble additional food kits with the specified items, embracing a strategy of consolidating these donations through [bulk packaging](#).<sup>16</sup> This approach was tailored to complement the absent items from previous kits, ultimately fulfilling the criteria for a comprehensive relief kit. Thus despite the challenge of dispatching complete kits, a notable achievement was the successful acquisition of the missing items through KSDMA and in-kind donations, facilitating their bulk distribution.

Some rice sacks were directed to a wholesale shop, and the proceeds were contributed to the [Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund](#).<sup>17</sup> Chief Ministers Distress Relief Fund of TN paid by KSDMA from transfer of non-useful materials received to shops.

## PHASE II – UTENSILS KIT

Upon returning to their homes, individuals found them completely vacant and, to start anew, they needed to cook food. Unfortunately, the floodwaters had washed away their cooking utensils. In response to the urgent needs identified by Tamil Nadu government authorities, we promptly organised the procurement of cooking utensils.

A [utensil kit](#)<sup>18</sup> comprising 8 items<sup>19</sup> essential items per household, was curated, resulting in the successful dispatch of 1558 utensil kits.

As part of the campaign, [additional steel accessories](#),<sup>20</sup> including 22 plates, 40 kalam, 20 tablespoons, 38 ladles, 22 bowls, and 60 knives, were received in kind and subsequently sent in sacks and boxes.

Significantly, all the utensils were obtained through in-kind donations, with substantial support coming from [key contributors](#).<sup>21</sup> The Kerala Gazetted Officers Association (KGOA), Association of Mar Ivanios College Old Students (AMICOS), and Chamber of Commerce stand out as the primary contributors of the utensils kit.

## PHASE III – SINGLE BURNER GAS STOVES

Upon additional requests from the Tamil Nadu government authorities, there was a need for single-burner gas stoves, and we promptly took steps to procure them. A total of 349 stoves were successfully sent to the designated destination.

In the [16<sup>th</sup> load](#),<sup>22</sup> 99 purchased stoves were dispatched, and one stove was retained as a sample at the KSDMA office, bringing the total procured to 100. The remaining 250 stoves received in kind were directly delivered to Thoothukudi from Ramachandra-Chennai on the [15<sup>th</sup> load](#).<sup>23</sup> The main contributors of the single burner stoves are CREDAI and Kerala Gazetted Officers Association (KGOA).

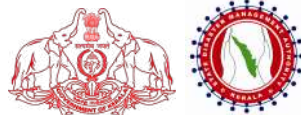
## PHASE IV – CATTLE FEEDS

In disasters, it's not only humans who suffer, but animals are also significantly affected. Recognising the impact on animals, the அன்போடு கேரளம்/ANBODU KERALAM

initiative prioritised their welfare as well. An illustrative example of this concern is the distribution of cattle feed as part of the Tamil Nadu flood relief material drive.

On December 27<sup>th</sup>, a specific request for cattle feed was received. To meet the urgency and required quantity, we efficiently procured 6 tons of feed from Kerala Feeds LTD. To expedite the process, considering the supply's origin, the load was directly dispatched to the specified regions in Tamil Nadu from Palakkad.

As per the request, the [13<sup>th</sup> shipment](#)<sup>24</sup> was sent directly to three locations: the initial delivery to Thiruchandhur Taluk, the second to Eral Taluk, and the final to Srivaikundam Taluk. Each taluk received a distribution of 2 tons of cattle feed.

## PHASE V – ANTI-FUNGAL CREAM

The rising cases of itching and allergies on legs and hands, stemming from exposure to the flooded and contaminated water during cleaning, prompted authorities to seek anti-fungal cream.

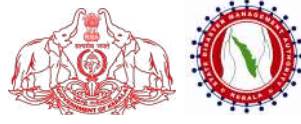


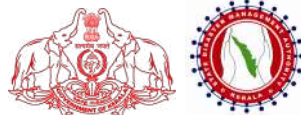
Figure 5: The initial shipment of anti-fungal cream packed in boxes for dispatch.

In response to this request, the team swiftly mobilised to procure and dispatch Candid, Ketoscore 6, Trioderm Plus, Whitefield, Beclofresh, Clofresh GM Neo, Clotreat 4x, Ketoscore CT, and Lulimark, meeting the urgent need. A total of 7000 tubes of anti-fungal cream was shipped to Tamil Nadu.

The Anti-fungal cream from both Kerala Medical Services Corporation Ltd (KMCL) and Nachiyar Pharm has been received through both [in-kind](#)<sup>25</sup> donations and [procurement](#)<sup>26</sup> by KSDMA.

## PHASE VI – BLEACHING POWDER

After the floodwaters receded, the substantial debris accumulated around houses and buildings necessitating a significant quantity of cleaning materials for the clean-up. Consequently, the Tamil Nadu Government authorities requested bleaching powder to aid in cleaning.

Upon receiving this request, the team immediately mobilised to procure bleaching powder. Consequently, the [4<sup>th</sup> load](#)<sup>27</sup> from the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority included the requested bleaching powder. 1040 packets of bleaching powder was sent to Tamil Nadu.

## PHASE VII – SAREE & T-SHIRT

Additionally, there was a request for sarees and t-shirts, after conducting a quality check on the sarees, considering the availability, quality, and quantity. A total of 995 sarees and 750 t-shirts are shipped to Tamil Nadu. The sarees were procured from Pothys (207 nos.) and Ramachandra (750 nos.).

The Poonam sarees from Pothys were provided in kind, while the Hyderabad cotton sarees and t-shirts (950 nos.) from Ramachandra were [procured](#)<sup>28</sup> by KSDMA. Initially, one piece of saree was added to 207 kits, and subsequently, the remaining sarees and [38 received](#)<sup>29</sup> in kind in addition were [sent in bulk](#).<sup>30</sup> The same approach was applied to the procured t-shirts, which were also [sent in bulk](#).<sup>31</sup>

The non-essential materials received from contributors were sent to shops, and the payment received by the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) was subsequently forwarded to the [Chief Minister's Distress Relief Fund of Tamil Nadu](#).<sup>32</sup>

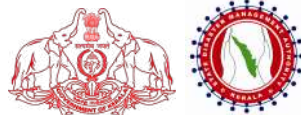

The initiation of the collection drive on December 22, 2023, received extensive support from volunteers. A collective of over 200 volunteers, including individuals from Aapda Mitra, Civil Defence in the Thiruvananthapuram circle, Student Police Cadets from S. M. V Govt. 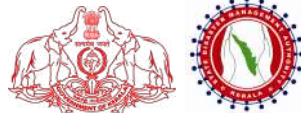
The primary activities performed by volunteers encompassed loading and unloading relief materials, as well as packing and assembling the collected items.

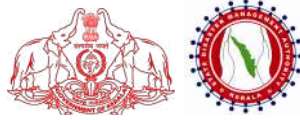

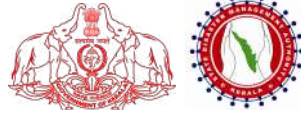


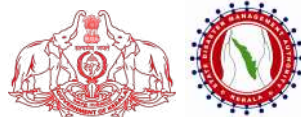
Figure 11: (left) M. G. Rajamanikam IAS, Dr P. Pugazhendi IFS Dr Sekhar L. Kuriakose and Unnikrishnan Liaison officer in discussion (right) P. H. Kurian IAS interacting with the ANBODU KERALAM 2023 team

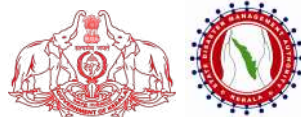

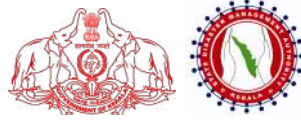


Figure 14: (left) Principal Secretary Smt. Tinku Biswal IAS interacting with the younger volunteers (right) the young volunteers receiving relief kit (down) young volunteers helping the initiative

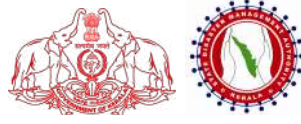
## ASWATHY THE ALL-ROUNDER!

## THE CHEERFUL JASEENA

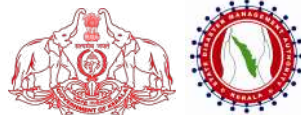

## THE IRON LADIES!

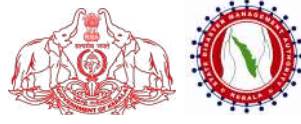

### SUJA THE TRAVELLER

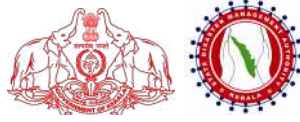

The diverse relief materials were made possible solely through selfless contributions. The accumulated stockpile of relief materials, facilitated by in-kind donations, not only strengthened our emergency response preparedness but also allowed for the swift deployment of resources during crises. This ensured a timely and effective response to emerging needs. The [major contributors](#)<sup>33</sup> are government institutions, individuals, businesses, organisations and humanitarian institutions.

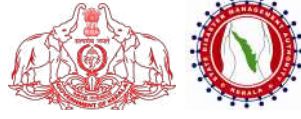

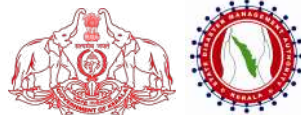


## The ANONYMOUS

## BEING THE CHANGE

Even in times of distress, we must aspire to be change-makers, extending a helping hand to those in need within the constraints of our capabilities. Through the ANBODU KERALAM initiative, we had the privilege of extending assistance to those in need, thanks to the support of our contributors.

The food kit dispatched to Tamil Nadu prominently featured Ponni Rice, a widely consumed variety in the Thirunelveli-Thuthukudy belt. Due to its specific demand, only Ponni Rice was sent to Tamil Nadu. However, the generous contributions of [various rice varieties](#),<sup>34</sup> both in sacks and packets, for the flood relief drive allowed us to diversify our support. [Other rice varieties](#),<sup>35</sup> such as Jaya, Palakadan Matta, Vadimatta, etc., were distributed to the Vanchi Poor Fund - Ammaveed<sup>36</sup>, an old-age home for women.



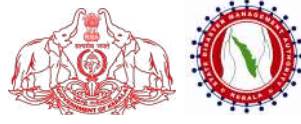
Figure 16 : Figure 16: Mr Madhusoodanan of Vanchi Poor Fund - Ammaveed collecting the rice kits from KSDMA

In addition to rice, we received various items in limited quantities and not initially specified by authorities. These included coriander powder, puttupodi, milk powder, oats, masala powder, handwash, sanitiser, coconut oil, Dettol, old stocked and used clothes, and dry chillies. These items

## THE CERTIFICATION

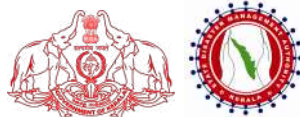
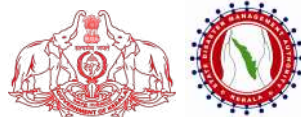


Figure 18 : Certificate of appreciation curated by KSDMA for the volunteers, (left) for adult volunteers, (right) for younger volunteers, (down left) for contributors and (down right) for vendors

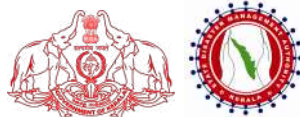


Figure 19: Pictures showing the 2<sup>nd</sup> load starting from Kerala State Disaster Management Authority

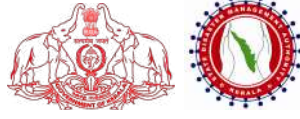

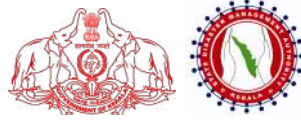


Figure 20: Pictures of the 3<sup>rd</sup> load starting from Kerala State Disaster Management Authority

During this period, our attention was drawn to a significant development: “Approximately 96 pregnant women, with delivery dates within the next 30 days, were identified. Among them, 142 were admitted to primary health centres, government and private hospitals, and Tirunelveli Medical College Hospital. Of these, 91 women successfully gave birth”,<sup>50</sup> prompting us to mobilise resources for baby diapers. In the 7th load, we successfully dispatched 8 boxes of Pampers for infants.

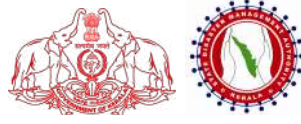

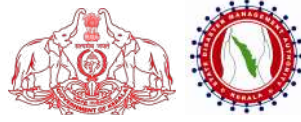

Our approach in the collection drive was need-based, and we incorporated additional materials/items based on further requests from the Tamil Nadu government. During the later stages of the collection drive, we received a request for cooking utensils. Responding promptly, we curated a [utensils kit](#) with 8 items per household.



The challenges of extensive Christmas shopping and time constraints in bulk utensil procurement made it difficult to acquire items, but due to the urgency, we packaged the utensil kits based on the items received promptly. In the 8<sup>th</sup> load, we successfully dispatched a total of 201 complete kits, along with 18 kits (without kadai) and 45 kits (without saucepan & kadai).

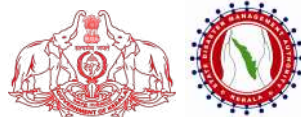

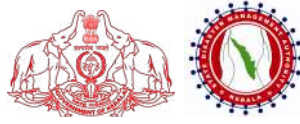

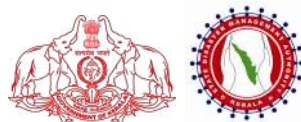

## NOTE

Following the successful assembly of 1000 kits in adherence to the guidelines, we experienced substantial cooperation and contributions from various communities, including local self-government institutions such as grama panchayats, block panchayats, municipalities, corporations, unions, associations, humanitarian collectives, and individual donors. A significant portion of these contributions consisted of bulk single items, such as clothing, rice, atta, rawa, etc.

To ensure timely delivery of materials to the affected areas, we adopted the approach of consolidating these contributions into bulk packaging, aligning with the missing items from previous kits and completing the requirements for one comprehensive kit. Consequently, the 10th load was dispatched with 649 lungis, 649 nighties, 2596 towels, and 753 bedsheets.

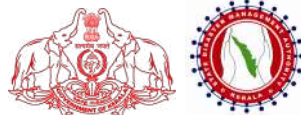

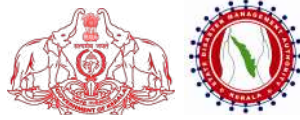


Figure 26: LinkedIn post about the collection drive

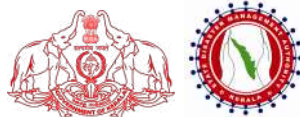



Figure 27: The Facebook post about the drive

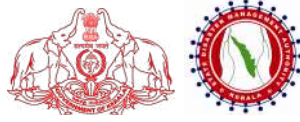

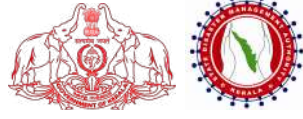

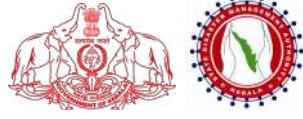


Sample of Ponni rice procured from PAULRAJ & COMPANY

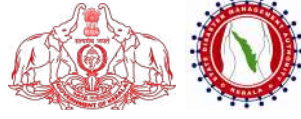

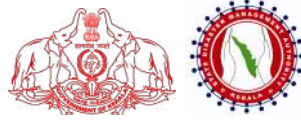

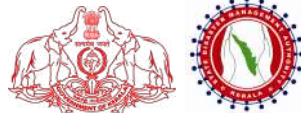

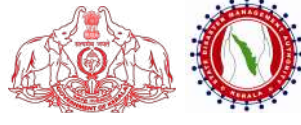

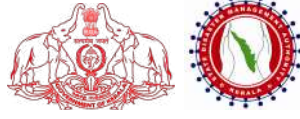
