REPORT

Two days training programme on Disaster Mnagement, Basic Life Support and First Aid was jointly organised by the National Service Scheme, University of Kerala and Kerala State Disaster Management Authority on 21& 22 June 2018 at Senate Chamber, University of Kerala, Palayam, Thiruvananthapuram. It was mainly organised for the benefit of the Volunteer Secretaries/Volunteer Leaders of the National Service Scheme, University of Kerala. There are 164 NSS Units for the University of Kerala spread over the four southern districts of Keral; a namely Thiruvananthapuram, Kollam, Alappuzha and Pathanamthitta. The basic aim of the training programme was to create awareness among the Volunteer Secretaries and Volunteer leaders on disaster management, basic life support and first aid. It is expected that the volunteers who may undergone training may disseminate the knowledge that they acquired among other volunteers of their respective NSS units.

For the second day (22 June 2018) there were 2 venues ie., Senate Chamber and Student's Centre PMG Junction. Accommodation facility was provided at International Youth Hostel, University of Kerala located at PMG, Thiruvananthapuram.

The training programme started with an inaugural function arranged at the Senate Chamber, Palayam at 10am on Thursday the 21st of June 2018. After the prayer sung by Ms. Punya S., Volunteer Secretary, All Saints College, Thiruvananthapuram Dr. Shaji A., Programme Coordinator, National Service Scheme, University of Kerala welcomed the dignitaries and participants.
