EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report details the capacity building programme conducted for persons with disabilities in Kerala. The project was funded by the Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) as part of their project on "Strengthening emergency response capabilities of the differently abled."

Disaster risk reduction is the systematic development and application of policies, strategies and practices to minimize vulnerabilities and disaster risks throughout a society, to avoid (prevention) or to limit (mitigation and preparedness) adverse impact of hazards, within the broader context of sustainable



development. Natural disasters cannot be prevented, but the disaster risk can be alleviated by enhancing capacities and reducing vulnerabilities.



Persons with Disabilities are more vulnerable to disasters than others. The Socio-economic and physical vulnerabilities make them very susceptible to disasters. Surprisingly, the issue of training persons with disabilities in disaster risk reduction has not been properly addressed in development planning.

Right to Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 emphasizes the need to have disability inclusive disaster risk reduction activities for the persons with disabilities. There are 7, 93,937 persons with disabilities in the State according to the disability census 2015. To equip persons with disabilities in disaster risk reduction, Inter University centre for Disability Studies is associating with Kerala State Disaster Management Authority in a project titled 'Strengthening of Emergency Response Capabilities with Emphasis on Differently Abled People' in the year 2016. The objective of the project is to equip the persons with disabilities to respond to various disasters or emergencies.

COMPREHENSIVE REPORT

INTRODUCTION

Disability is a part of the human condition. More than one billion people in the world live with some form of disability, of whom nearly 200 million experience considerable difficulties in functioning (WHO World Report on Disability, 2011). In India, people with disabilities comprise between 4 and 8 percent of the Indian population (around 40-90 million individuals). In the years ahead, disability will be an even greater concern because its prevalence is on the rise. The number of people with disabilities is increasing due to population growth, ageing, emergence of chronic diseases and medical advances that preserve and prolong life, creating overwhelming demands for health and rehabilitation services (Srivastava and Khan, 2008). Despite the increase in prevalence of disability worldwide, due to various reasons, not much attention has been paid to its evaluation, management and prevention (WHO, 2002). Across the world, people with disabilities have poorer health outcomes, lower education achievements, less economic participation and higher rates of poverty than people without disabilities. This is partly because people with disabilities experience barriers in accessing services, including health, education, employment, and transport as well as information. These difficulties are exacerbated in less advantaged communities in Kerala. The lack of effective financing for support or its distribution within the country is a major obstacle to sustainable services.

Empowering the persons with disability has been the most neglected subject in the social development sector. Not many organizations have taken up the holistic approach of providing services to the persons with disabilities in which all types of services right from early intervention through education; vocational training and livelihood programs to independent living are designed in the programs. The state wide training programme on strengthening emergency response capabilities of the differently abled in Kerala can stand as a unique programme to elaborate the activities to support persons with disabilities and fetch them to the mainstream of the society.

Disability in Kerala

Department of Social justice and empowerment, Govt. of Kerala conducted a state wide disability census in 2015. Kerala has been the first state which initiated a complete census of persons with disabilities across the state. The census included 22 types of disabilities and the report has broadly classified them, in the order of prevalence, as movement disability, muscular dystrophy, chronic neurological disorder, multiple- sclerosis, hunched back, dwarfism, blindness, seriously impeded vision, learning disability, speech disability, mental retardation, mental illness, autism, deafness, leprosy free persons, haemophilia, thalassemia, sickle cell anaemia, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, deaf & blind and multiple-disabilities. As per the census there were 7, 93,937 persons with disabilities in Kerala which constitutes 2.3 per cent of the total population of the state.

The report shows that an estimate of 9.87 lakh households in Kerala is affected by some form of disability, which constitutes 11.01 per cent of the total number of dwellings in the state.

Disaster risk of Kerala

- ➤ 8th most densely populated in the country
- ➤ 14.5% of the State is flood prone
- ➤ 14.4% of the State is landslide prone
- > 55.5% of the coastline prone to coastal hazards
- The State falls in Zone 3 in the national seismic zonation map
- ➤ About 70 people die of lightning every year
- ➤ 65 out of 10,000 vehicles prone to accidents in the state (national average is 42.3/10,000) About 45% of LPG used in the state is transported via roads
- ➤ Variability of weather patterns due to global warming is evident in the state
 (Kuriakose, 2016)

RATIONALE

Disasters have a huge impact on human infrastructure, lives and livelihoods. They can result from natural causes (earthquakes, floods, cyclones, etc.) or from human influenced factors (like climate change and conflicts) which can lead to food insecurity and displacement of large populations. While it remains crucial to

understand and reduce the human effect in creating disasters, natural causes will continue. The key in diminishing their impact is to reduce people's vulnerability. Through inclusive Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) programmes, incorporated in human development plans and poverty reduction programmes, risks can be reduced and communities' resilience to disasters can be strengthened. Persons with disabilities are often overlooked throughout the disaster management cycle and especially during relief operations, and are seldom considered as important actors in conflict prevention even though they are often more exposed during conflicts and displacement. Those with physical impairments can be at risk when evacuating, if assistance is not available. Individuals with cognitive impairments may struggle with understanding instructions that must be followed in the event a disaster occurs. Those who are visually or hearing impaired may have difficulty communicating during the emergency. All of these factors can increase the degree of variation of risk in disaster situations among people with disabilities. United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disability (CRPD) defines 'Persons with disabilities as those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others" The UNCRPD, in its articles 11 and 322, requires that persons with disabilities benefit from and participate in disaster relief, emergency response and disaster risk reduction strategies.

In the last two decades, Kerala has experienced an increase in the frequency and intensity of disasters whose economic impact has proved to be devastating. The lessons learned from the lengthening trail of disasters, have led to a gradual realization that while hazards may be natural, disasters are largely. 'man-made'. They largely result from the failures of development policies and practices that distort the trajectories of sustainable development, affecting the poorest sections the most.

The persons with disabilities deserve proper care, protection, training, employment and rehabilitation. The socio-economic and physical vulnerabilities make them very susceptible to disasters. Surprisingly, the issue of training persons with disabilities in DRR has not been properly addressed. As a sign of support and belief in the concept of disaster risk reduction, state wide training programme to

promote good practices of Disability inclusive Disaster Risk Reduction that will show concrete practical examples of how persons with disabilities can be active participants in various DRR interventions. The centre is planning to disseminate sustainable resilience mechanisms to disaster risk reduction strategies to make it aware of the added value that trained and knowledgeable persons with disabilities bring.

AIM

Contribute to the national policy for inclusion and complete participation of the differently abled by including them in the disaster management programme)

OBJECTIVES

- Empanel a cadre of experts as resource persons in the field of disability inclusive disaster risk management.
- Create awareness among the teachers, parents/caregivers about disability inclusive disaster risk management across the state.
- Empower the persons with disabilities to prepare for disasters/emergencies.
- Strengthen the emergency response capabilities of persons with disabilities across the state. To develop sustainable plans to strengthen the capacities of the differently abled in DRR

KEY TRAINING STRATEGIES ADOPTED

Course contents

The major contents of the training course are given below: --

- ➤ Basics on Disaster Management and Disaster Risk Reduction
- Understanding Disability Vulnerabilities of persons with disabilities in Pre, During and Post Disaster Periods
- Measures to Reduce Risks of persons with disabilities. Basic first aid& survival skills

Method

The method for conducting the programme was as follows:

- Brainstorming Sessions
- > Lecture
- Participatory
- Discussion
- > Experience Sharing
- > Feedback
- ➤ Simulation Games / Ice- breakers / Energizers
- > Self-Analysis
- Case Study

Training materials and equipment used

The different training aids like white board, Marker, Poster, paper and Permanent markers, Laptop, Multimedia projector, Maps and Posters will be used for the training programme. In addition to this, posters, brochures and pamphlets in Braille is needed for persons with visual impairments. Assistive communication devices will be needed for persons with various other disabilities.

The support of the sign language interpreter may require on need basis.

Training materials are made in Braille, Sign Language Videos, Posters, DAISY format audio brochures etc. By SDMA.

THE PARTICIPANTS

The participants of the programme were selected persons with various disabilities and their caregivers across the state. A total of 2667 persons with various disabilities attended the training programmes across the state. Break up of participants is given as Appendix. Since, Persons with disabilities are particularly affected by changes in terrain resulting from disaster because of inadequate physical accessibility, mobility aids or appropriate assistance, the training was focused on to build disaster management capabilities among the PWDs. The training was aimed at equipping them to get aware about the risks around them. The trainings helped them to prepare for hazards and the likely emergency situations.

MATERIALS AND ACCESSIBILITY CONSIDERATIONS

IUCDS had taken farthest care to ensure the accessibility for all to attend the programme. The venues arranged were accessible for all in the 14 districts. All the

efforts were made to help the persons with disabilities to attend the training programme comfortably. Facilities like wheel chairs, ramps, hand rails etc. were made available before the conduct of each programme. Further a minimum TA was also given to the participants who attended the programme.

The participants of the training were divided into four categories according to their communication skills viz. Visually Impaired, Speech & Hearing, Physical, and Intellectual) for intellectual disability, the care givers were trained.

The trainers used different methods to address the four types of disabilities.

The proposed training programme "strengthening emergency response capacities of the differently abled" was a series of training programmes and activities to ensure its access to a cross section of persons with disabilities and their caregivers in the 14 districts of Kerala. The Programme was proposed to accomplish its aim within 6 months. But IUCDS took more than 14 months to complete the training programme due to the Nippa epidemic and the huge flooding in 2018.

Table 1: Training methods and materials used for persons with various disabilities

Disability Group	Method & Materials
Visually Impaired,	Lecture Method – Words/Lessons spoken by the facilitator. Audio messages – Facilitator may use audio messages, like audio brochures produced by KSDMA on various hazards. Braille material – Most of the visually impaired people could read messages on braille format. Discussion Method was also used for this group
Speech & Hearing impaired	For this group, the facilitator used Visual presentations like PPT, Photographs, Video formats etc. Also, the facilitator used texts for those who could read. Help of an interpreter were also made available to speak to the group and to receive feedback to the facilitator. Demonstration method was used so that the trainees can see and learn. (Eg: CPR) Role playing method – This method is effective while conducting mock drills and demonstration exercises.
Physically disabled	This group relatively followed most of the methods & materials. Lecture Method Demonstration method Role Playing Guided Group Discussion Power Point Presentations Video/Audio Materials
 Persons with intellectual disabilities 	This group, unlike other groups, may not follow most of the methods. This depends on the severity of the impairment. Hence, The caregivers of the intellectually challenged were trained. All the above methods were used for training the care givers.

The final schedule for the training is given in the appendix

There were three stages for the programme. The first stage was the empanelling of experts in the field of disabilities and disaster management as resource persons. Three TOT training were conducted and empanelled around 140 persons as expert resource persons. Also, some of the NGOs, disability organizations and other agencies were identified to associate with IUCDS for the conduct of the training programme. The programme was organized with the support of district disaster management authority and the social justice department in each district.

The second stage was conduct training programme for the persons with disabilities and their care givers in the 14 districts of Kerala. The third stage was monitoring evaluation and reporting.

KEY LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOME

Participants of the training were persons with various disabilities. In terms of disasters and inclusive disaster risk reduction, most of the participants had very less awareness. Learning about inclusive DRR were new to them.

It was found that at the beginning of the training the participants were not interacting with each other. However, through group discussion and group work, they learned to work together and interact. This was useful to help both resource persons and participants to understand each other better.

The resource persons used various training strategies to help the participants to understand the concept better. The sessions were made accessible to all. Training participants mentioned that the sessions were informative and helpful to prepare well for disasters.

Case Study -I

The volunteers of Thanal palliative and Paraplegic care centre, Ernakulam attended the TOT training programme conducted by IUCDS before the massive flood which devastated Kerala in August 2018. The volunteers were actively participated in the rescue operations and they informed us that with the help of the training they received, they could rescue all the persons with disabilities in ernakulam district.

SUSTAINABILITY

The success of any programme depends upon the sustainability of the same. The centre will take efforts to arrange refresher courses/ follow up trainings after six months or as per requirements. A centre/ NGO will be identified in each districts to coordinate the follow up programmes.

MONITORING, EVALUATION AND REPORTING

The centre systematically observed and monitored the progress and quality of the training programme on frequent intervals with the support of the NGO's associated with the centre for the training programme. The centre deputed a faculty to coordinate and evaluate the whole progress and quality of each programme.

Further, IUCDS will use several sources to evaluate the effectiveness of the training programme. This include competency assessment and sustainability evaluation after a six months of completing the whole process using direct contact over phone or social media, with the help of the supporting agencies in the concerned area, surveys and focus groups of program participants, and a mock accreditation visit if needed.

PROGRAMME EVALUATION

ACHIEVEMENTS

Inter University Centre for disability studies (IUCDS) of Mahatma Gandhi University is the pioneering educational institution that carried out a tailor made training programme exclusively for persons with disabilities across the state of Kerala. As a sign of support and belief in the concept of disaster risk reduction, a training programme for the differently abled persons in Kerala to promote good practices of Disability inclusive Disaster Risk Reduction that will show concrete practical examples of how the persons with disabilities can be active participants in various DRR interventions. The centre trained around 3000 persons with different disabilities on sustainable resilience mechanisms to disaster risk reduction strategies to make it aware of the added value that trained and knowledgeable persons with disabilities bring. IUCDS was associating with Kerala State Disaster Management Authority (KSDMA) in their project "Strengthening Emergency response capabilities of the Differently Abled in Kerala"

The project was recognized as a model project by National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and included in national framework for disaster risk reduction. Besides Dr. Eddie Noppu, UN Secretary General's SDG advocate visited the Kerala Pavilion of KSDMA in the world reconstruction conference held at Geneva this year in may 2019 and overwhelmed by the disability inclusive DRR Programme. Also, in Post Disaster Need Assessment (PDNA) Report, United Nations mentioned about IUCDS in the context of this project.

- New national framework on DRR is inclusive and the participants from other organizations who were involved in the project's capacity building workshops were engaged in the process of advocacy and lobbying for the inclusion of disability across the state. The project directly contributed to success in recognition of disability inclusive DRR.
- Capacity building process has succeeded in raising awareness on disability inclusive DRR for both DRR and disability actors. The project brought together persons with disabilities and disaster experts to the community level and government officials to learn new knowledge and skills and contributed to changing attitudes. Growing demand for information on the 'how-to' of

- inclusive DRR at the moment was noted.
- Some members of the TOT trained resource persons actively involved in the project have engaged in DRR activities as trainers or resource persons not only for people with disabilities, but also for the broader community.
- The capacity building process has succeeded in building working linkages between NGOs and related government stakeholders for DRR.

WORKED STRATEGIES

The following strategies were worked very well during the whole process

- Accessibility provided for training participants such as Braille materials, sign language interpreter, accessible venue, etc. really supported enabling participants to be more engaged in the training process In order to provide sufficient and proper accessibility, we just need to simply ask participants well beforehand what they need to support them in the training and make sure we can provide that.
- Continuous engagement and discussion with both NGOs and government regarding what information they need and how this project and others going forward can continue to learn from and accommodate the information and training that government and NGOs need.
- Regular project team reflection and evaluation helped to improve the quality and delivery of capacity building trainings.

DIFFICULTIES EXPERIENCED

- Need better strategy to accommodate participants with hearing difficulty in an inclusive class. Most of the time, it depends on the quality of Sign language interpreter (SLI). Evaluation from the project team about the sign language interpreter had been conducted and significant improvement made.
- Involvement of government in the training process was considered not optimal. Government had a great role in introducing basic DRR to participants, but afterwards their involvement became restricted largely to giving opening speeches. Consider better strategy for involvement of government in ongoing capacity building in the future, to encourage more active involvement at all stages of the training and capacity building process.
- Consider making training duration for longer to allow more practice and

- better understanding, and with more opportunities for hands-on trainings and participation.
- Too many participants in some of the districts: This sometimes made it difficult for the project staff to accommodate all the participants' needs and ensure that all participants had the same level of understanding. Consider to limit number of participants in each class in the future.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Discussing Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) in the absence of people with disabilities is equal to disregarding their existence as community members vulnerable to disaster risk. This means that participation of people with disabilities is essential, if not mandatory in disaster risk reduction activities. Through this participation, we will be able to discover detailed nuances pivotal to identification of the need and the capacity of people with disabilities in disaster risk reduction in a certain region. The detail is once again very important compared to general information. Hence, the engagement of people with disabilities in disaster risk reduction activities is crucial

Following are the main recommendations by the team who conducted the training programme throughout the state.

- In the capacity building component and particularly the workshops, consider quality vs quantity. Too many participants will not be efficient in the process of capacity building
- Having more TOT workshops with participants had standout performances, can be conducted to disseminate trainings to all the persons with disabilities.
- Better initial assessment on the knowledge of participants for each particular topic in so that the workshops are better targeted to their learning needs and also more prior discussion with the participants about what strategies are needed to support the delivery of each programme in their area.
- Regular follow up after each training programme is not enough when done only via remote support from the implementing agency. Consider having a local staff member posted in each region to follow up with engagement. Better strategy for engagement with government. Prepare well and provide a clear and active role for government in the delivery of quality training. This is

important so that it further encourages interaction and engagement between government and persons with disabilities. The training programme should make a part of the curriculum of the courses related to disability and disaster management.

- > Special trainings on inclusive DRR should be given to the rehabilitation professionals, students and caregivers of persons with disabilities to ensure their complete participation in the DM activities.
- The training should be given to all the persons with disabilities using working strategies
- The government departments related to disaster management and disabilities should immediately make arrangements to follow up the programme conducted by the team and I hope that the survey team will also receive information on the actions taken by the government.
- Ensure the latest technologies to be used in inclusive DRR trainings
- The programme should be oriented to the practical difficulties experienced by the persons with disabilities during disasters and trainings must be oriented in such a way that no one is left behind.
- The training can be extended to the school curriculum too.

PROGRAMME COMMITTEE

TRAINING OF TRAINERS (TOT) IN INLCLUSIVE DRR

Training and development of Master Trainers in Inclusive DRR was an instrument to meet the twin challenges of continuous improvement of the skills to train persons with various disabilities and demands of change. There is an everemerging challenge of capacity-building of such trainers. Thus, it is necessary to recognize the crucial role of the Master Trainer from being a provider to enabler, facilitator and change-agent where learner who is a person with disability is in the focus.

IUCDS and KSDMA jointly organized three State Level Training of Trainers (ToT) programme. 140 professionals from different sectors were selected and trained as resource persons to conduct training in Inclusive DRR for persons with disabilities.

Objectives

Training of Trainers programme was designed to provide opportunities to Master Trainers for the development of skills to facilitate create and manage a differently abled learner in the inclusive DRR training programme. The programme was aimed to provide Training to Master Trainers to achieve advanced facilitation skills towards the end to end training of persons with disabilities.

The training program aims to achieve following learning outcomes:

- Develop and enhance training, facilitation and learning practices for persons with disabilities in inclusive DRR
- Prepare to facilitate learning sessions and help reflect and improve practice through appropriate evaluation
- Facilitate learning sessions using appropriate training methods, learning enabling techniques and use of ICT and assistive devices for persons with disabilities.

Through these training programs, a cadre of Certified Master Trainers (domain & training delivery skills) shall be developed to cater to the skilling ecosystem of Inclusive disaster risk reduction.





Inter University Centre for Disability Studies (IUCDS) is a unique centre of Mahatma Gandhi University, conceived as a place for collective learning, actions and reflections based on the human rights framework for the national vision of inclusion and complete participation of persons with disabilities. IUCDS envisioned contributing to emerging participatory action research in disability studies in a transdisciplinary perspective. The centre has active participation and involvement of multi-disciplinary group of scholars, scientists, educationist, special educators, rehabilitation professionals, psychologists and health educators who could contribute to the field of disability studies in a holistic perspective. The centre has been initiated several academic and research oriented activities. Presently, the centre offers M.Phil. programme in disability studies. CONCLUSION

Inclusion of persons with disabilities in disaster risk reduction is not an easy task. It requires technical skill, knowledge and positive attitude of the people who are closely working with this issue. An Organizing and conducting a state level training programme on "strengthening emergency response capabilities of the differently abled" was an experimental one for the very first time in Kerala. To make this effort a sustainable one, a training module power point presentations were developed on the basis of the experiences gathered and learned, so that it could be replicated and reach to more people with disabilities. Refreshers course for the participants can also be considered.

Discussing the hazards encountered and the learning all the new knowledge and skills of inclusive DRR helped the organizers to take disability inclusive programs seriously. The whole process involved hard work and commitment on all sides. However as each of the case studies demonstrate, being involved in disability inclusive learning and applying this learning is life changing for both people with disabilities and their non-disabled peers.
